Welcome to OutFest 2024! We are overjoyed that this OutFest marks our third festival here in Kjipuktuk/Halifax, and ninth overall!

The festival has become a crucial platform in the theatre ecology not only here in Nova Scotia, but across the region, and across the country. OutFest provides emerging and established Queer artists with space to create and present their work, while also inviting audiences to engage with the stories being told. These spaces, especially Queer spaces, are vital to our immediate and extended community.

Increasingly, artistic platforms have come under threat; The Toronto Fringe, Just For Laughs, Hot Docs, and Luminato - all face financial challenges as they move forward. Some have chosen to cancel or pause their events, while others are trying to adapt with smaller programming. Without increased financial support from all levels of Government, they risk being shut down.

In addition to a lack of funding, all artists are under threat from colonizations' latest tool, AI. We risk having our ideas, our thoughts, our voices and sounds exploited in ways we could never imagine. This only further punctuates the need for spaces like this.

This week we have gathered to support stories and artists across various stages. We have come to exchange ideas and experiences with friends and our community. I encourage you to see as much as you can, to chat with artists you've never met, to engage and listen to all that is being presented and shared.

Let this be the first step that carries us forward and inspires us to never stop pushing.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT


Page1 Theatre and OutFest want to acknowledge that our festival takes place here in Kjipuktuk/Halifax, the ancestral home of the Mi'kmaq people. We honour the people who have been here for time immemorial and continue to do so to this day.

We also want to welcome the artists joining us today from the unceded and traditional territories of the Beothuk, the Innu of Nitassinan, the Inuit of Nunatsiavut, and the Inuit of NunatuKavut. As well as the unceded traditional territory of the Algonquin Anishinabeg, and folks from the traditional territory of Tkaronto, "the gathering place." The original caretakers of that land being, the Anishinaabe, including the Mississaugas of Credit, Haudenosaunee, and Wyndat nations

We must acknowledge that colonial genocide continues to impact Indigenous people across Turtle Island and the world. Terms like colonialism and imperialism are not in the past, as we see them playing out in places like the Amazon Rain Forest, Gaza, and Ukraine, to name a few.

We have a responsibility, whether we have been here for several generations or are newcomers, to learn from the past so that we can move towards reconciliation.

CONTEMPORARY DANCE SOLO ROBERT AZEVEDO

Contemporary Dance Solo is a solo dance show with a hint of bouffon. The performer (Robert Azevedo) recreates 18 dance solos from various youth dance competitions back-to-back! The audience gets to see Azevedo's rendition alongside projected videos of the original performers.

The young dancers in the videos are virtuosic and talented - the kinds of bodies you think of when you imagine a dancer: young, flexible, feminine, wiry. Meanwhile, Azevedo's body is very unlike theirs. Completing these solos -which itself is a feat of endurance, artistry, and skill - they are asking themselves and the audience: Am I a good dancer too?

Set in an underwater world that reflects the island above it, "Deeper" takes us on a rocky journey across decades, through college classes, marriage and divorce, cross-country moves, familial tension, unlikely friendships, and heartbreak.

Told through a series of flashbacks and old letters, "Deeper" is a personal story of longing, love, and loss, wrapped in a cultural time capsule. A reminder of the fleeting nature of life and love, "Deeper" urges us to hold each other close and to love out loud - while we're still here, while we still can, and for those who never could.



PUSHED is a two-act play which explores themes of prison abolition, colonialism, state violence, sexual violence, and the importance of friendship and community for marginalized people On a night out with friends Clara, a young Mi'kmaw woman is charged and convicted with second-degree murder - a crime she does not believe she is guilty of. Now in prison, Clara is in danger and Nat, Bou and Kal attempt to break Clara out before it's too late.
